Implementation dates	Dates are arranged with groups to suit them; currently not offered to individuals.	
Mode	 Online: Taught sessions via Zoom, and self-study via Thinkific. In-person: One-week visit to the teaching university (face-to-face English sessions, networking with other academic disciplines and opportunities to socialise). 	
Length	Weeks	10 weeks.
	Total hours	80-100 hours approx. of study (not including travel or social events).
	Teaching hours	40 guided/taught hours.
	Self-study	40-60 hours.
Sessions groups	15 learners maximum per group.	
Rates	For bookings between 1st September 2024 and 31st August 2025: £9,950 per group (£663.33 per person –rate subject to variation by the teaching university depending on the number of final participants–, some meals included; travel and accommodation not included).	
Teaching objective	Development of a range of high level skills for delivering instruction in English, aimed at enhancing effective communication in British English for daily professional tasks, such as those performed by professors, business professionals, service staff, CEOs, and speakers, in contexts like lectures, tutorials, classrooms, conferences, and discussions, among others.	
Working methodology/material	 Taught sessions: Bespoke tasks and audiovisual material of taster lectures (all available online); Excerpts from TED Talks and news channels etc. for language extension; Both pedagogy and development of language skills (plenty of opportunity to talk in English and receive feedback in all sessions); Self-study: Follows the structure and themes of the online sessions; Complements and expands on subjects dealt with in class; Offers interactive practice based on authentic video materials; Provides formative feedback on completed tasks.
